




## **MOVEUP OHIO: EMPOWERING NORTHWEST OHIO'S FUTURE WORKFORCE**

The MoveUp Ohio program, launched in 2024 through a U.S. Department of Labor community grant, is making strides in helping young adults aged 16-24 across 13 counties in Northwest Ohio. Spearheaded with support from Representative Marcy Kaptur, the program targets the Ninth Congressional District and nearby counties sharing economic and workforce resources.

MoveUp Ohio has focused on connecting underserved youth to coaching, training, and employment opportunities this quarter.
